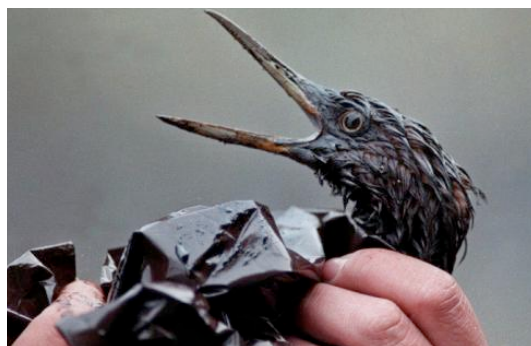
The Braer Oil Disaster: The Clean Up
