We have all learnt to appreciate our environment much more over the last few years, especially during the pandemic when we spent more time in our homes and also more time enjoying our nearby local outdoor spaces. The importance of safe clean air, both indoors and out, comfortable temperatures, and pleasant places to spend time appreciating nature, and taking some exercise is well known. We are also living in a time of environmental challenge, with higher global temperatures, and increased frequency of climactic events such as storms, floods and wildfires. A range of research questions being investigated by Lancaster University Centre for Ageing researchers, and our colleagues, are examining these specific issues as related to health and well-being in later life.

This one-day Town and Gown event will showcase work from Lancaster University's Centre for Ageing Research researchers and external partners, and present a series of studies examining issues relating to our interaction with our environment. Examples of the research to be included are research on air quality in terms of its status as a risk factor for cognitive impairment and dementia, on older adults' needs during disaster response and on the benefits of exercise for people who have recently experienced a bereavement

We will also hear from some of our PhD students on a wider range of projects from across the centre. There will be a chance to talk to some of our students and other researchers about their work in the lunchtime poster viewings, and learn about some ways to get involved yourself. And of course, we'll provide a light lunch, all in our exciting new Health Innovation One building.
